

## Provincial Amounts Transferred From Your Spouse or Common-law Partner

If your spouse or common-law partner is not filing a 2005 return, use the amounts that he or she would use on Form NB428 if filing a return. Attach his or her information slips, but do not attach the return or schedules.

If, at the end of the year, your spouse or common-law partner was not a resident of New Brunswick, special rules may apply. Call us for more details.
