The Crown Copyright and Licensing section (CCL) reviews your application form within 48 hours of receipt, and returns any forms that are either incomplete or illegible. If we have to return your form, we will send an explanatory note along with a copy of your form.

Your request will **not** be processed until you have provided all of the mandatory information required, at which point the request will be officially registered as received and assigned a file number. Each resubmission will result in longer processing times.
