## More Employers Join Passport to Safety for Young Workers

The number of Yukon *Passport to Safety* employers has doubled from six to 12 since fall – showing there is growing commitment to the safety of workers under 25. The employers cover a range of industries: hospitality, construction, recycling and transportation, to name a few.

"When many young people are being hired for summer work, it's more important than ever to be aware of the need to prevent work-related illnesses and injuries in youth," said Craig Tuton, Chair of the Yukon Workers' Compensation Health and Safety Board.

"We applaud the Yukon employers who have joined *Passport to Safety*. They are demonstrating a commitment to the safety of their most vulnerable employees. We encourage other employers to take the same step."

Passport to Safety is a national online program that takes young workers through a workplace safety test, providing basic knowledge of common workplace hazards. It does not replace specific workplace safety training that is required for every employee.

The program was launched nationally because statistics show workers under 25 face a high risk of workplace injury and illness. Young people are inexperienced, hesitant to ask questions, often not trained or supervised sufficiently, and unaware of common workplace hazards.

Passport to Safety employers, and their young workers, are featured in an advertising campaign taking place throughout May called: "It's happening! Be part of it."
