Back and neck pain expert comes to Whitehorse

Dr. Hamilton Hall, Canada's leading expert on back and neck pain, will be giving two public presentations in Whitehorse. Dr. Hall is known as "Canada's Back Doctor" and is the author of The Back Doctor. More Advice from the Back Doctor. Better Backs in 30 Days, The New Back Doctor, and The Canadian Back Institute Method to End Your Back and Neck Pain.

An estimated 60% to 80% of the population will suffer some form of back pain in their lifetime. According to Dr. Hall, "sore backs are so common, they are more of a human experience than an illness or a disease."

Everyone is invited to attend Dr. Halls' presentations, which will be held in Westmark Whitehorse on March 7. The first session will be from 2 until 4 pm and the second session will be from 7 until 9 pm. Both sessions will include a facilitated question and answer period. Admission is free.

Dr. Hall is professor in the Department of Surgery at the University of Toronto and coordinator of spine services at Sunnybrook and Women's College Health Sciences Centre in Toronto. He is also the founder and the present medical director of the Canadian Back Institute, the largest coordinated group of spinecare clinics in Canada.

Dr. Hall's presentations have been sponsored by the Law Society of Yukon, the Yukon Medical Association, the Yukon Registered Nurses Association and the Yukon Workers' Compensation Health and Safety Board.
