

May 1, 2006 Notice to Stakeholders

We are very pleased to draw your attention to a new measure in this month's report. Effective March 31, 2006, the ITA has established a system-wide measure of program completion. Apprenticeship completion rates are often held up as a key means for evaluating the quality and effectiveness of BC's industry training system.

Our targets for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2006 were to develop a unit of measurement (see below for detailed methodology) and establish a baseline completion rate. Both have been achieved.

The Completion Rate measure will now be included in all future Performance Measurement Reports with quarterly updates on the rate of completion. It will allow us to evaluate apprenticeship program completion system wide, as well as in individual industry training programs – thus allowing for comparison between different types of training. It will also enable us to set goals for improvement and to develop targeted initiatives to facilitate these goals.

Methodology:

The ITA has adopted a similar standard to that used to determine completion rates for post-secondary degree programs – i.e. measure completion six years after student registration. To establish a baseline measure, data was taken for newly registered trainees in Fiscal 99/00 on a quarter end by quarter end basis. This cohort was compared to the same quarter end in Fiscal 05/06 to determine the number of trainees that were certified six years later, resulting in the completion rate of 42% for the Fiscal 99/00 cohort. For Fiscal 06/07 we will be reporting the completion of the Fiscal 00/01 newly registered cohort on a quarterly basis.
