Serum creatinine

Subject

Instructions for the requirement of a serum creatinine laboratory test in the screening of clients with potential renal impairment in the context of the Canadian Immigration medical examination (IME).

Goal/Objective

These instructions are provided to ensure that panel physicians (PPs) follow a consistent and appropriate process for the following:

- identification of clients with abnormal history or findings that require the addition of serum creatinine test; and
- completion and grading of an IME for a client with abnormal serum creatinine results.

Instructions

Measuring serum creatinine is a useful and inexpensive method of evaluating the function of the body's major organs. These instructions identify **new** requirements for serum creatinine testing during the IME.

A serum creatinine test is mandatory for clients with the following:

- a history of diabetes;
- a history of heart condition including coronary disease, hypertension, valve or congenital disease;
- physical findings of hypertension ($\geq 140 / \geq 90$) during the IME; and/or
- abnormal **repeat** urinalysis (dipstick with +2 or +3 for blood, protein or glucose / abnormal microscopy).

PPs should also consider including a serum creatinine test for clients with the following:

- a history of kidney or bladder disease; and/or
- abnormal findings in relation to the cardiovascular system during the IME.

Grading


All IMEs for clients with abnormal history or abnormal physical examination who require serum creatinine testing must be graded B.
