MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,

Preamble

Whereas it appears by message from Her Excellency the Right Honourable Michaëlle Jean, Governor General of Canada, and the Estimates accompanying that message, that the sums mentioned below are required to defray certain expenses of the federal public administration, not otherwise provided for, for the financial year ending March 31, 2010, and for other purposes connected with the federal public administration;

May it therefore please Your Majesty, that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, that:

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the *Appropriation Act No. 1, 2009–10*.

2. From and out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, there may be paid and applied a sum not exceeding in the whole twenty-six billion, seven hundred and sixty million, two hundred and thirty-seven thousand, eight hundred and ninety-six dollars and forty-two cents towards defraying the several charges and expenses of the federal public administration from April 1, 2009 to March 31, 2010, not otherwise provided for, and being the aggregate of

Purpose and effect of each item

3. The amount authorized by this Act to be paid or applied in respect of an item may be paid or applied only for the purposes and subject to any terms and conditions specified in the item, and the payment or application of any amount pursuant to the item has such operation and effect as may be stated or described in the item.

Commitments

4. (1) Where an item in the Estimates referred to in section 2 purports to confer authority to enter into commitments up to an amount stated in the Estimates or increases the amount up to which commitments may be entered into under any other Act or where a commitment is to be entered into under subsection (2), the commitment may be entered into in accordance with the terms of that item or in accordance with subsection (2) if the amount of the commitment proposed to be entered into, together with all previous commitments entered into in accordance with this section or under that other Act, does not exceed the total amount of the commitment authority stated in that item or calculated in accordance with subsection (2).
