Board of Internal Economy Disclosure:

Posting of the *Members' Expenditures Report* for the first quarter of 2016–2017 and the *Public Registry of Designated Travellers* as at June 30, 2016

Ottawa – September 21, 2016 – The Honourable Geoff Regan, Speaker of the House of Commons and Chair of the Board of Internal Economy, confirmed today that the <u>Members' Expenditures Report</u> for the first quarter of 2016–2017 and the <u>Public Registry of Designated Travellers</u> as at June 30, 2016 are now publicly available on the Parliament of Canada website.

Members' Expenditures Report

The *Members' Expenditures Report* for the first quarter of 2016–2017 outlines Members' expenditures processed between April 1 and June 30, 2016. It includes the *Detailed Travel Points Report* and the *Detailed Hospitality Expenditures Report*.

The *Detailed Travel Points Report* provides additional information on Members' and authorized travellers' trips processed between April 1 and June 30, 2016 for which travel points were used.

The *Detailed Hospitality Expenditures Report* provides additional information on Members' hospitality expenditures processed between April 1 and June 30, 2016.

Public Registry of Designated Travellers

The *Public Registry of Designated Travellers* outlines Members' active designated travellers as at June 30, 2016.

Please note that all questions related to a specific Member's expenditures and/or designated travellers should be directed to that individual Member.

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Facts about Members' expenditure reporting at the House of Commons

- Members review and validate their portion of the Members' Expenditures Report in the Financial Portal prior to its publication.
- Members' expenditures must be incurred in the discharge of their parliamentary functions. These
 expenditures are approved by Members and their delegates in accordance with Board policy.
- Members' expenditures are submitted electronically via a system with built-in controls that are aligned with Board policy, after which they are subject to review by the House Administration.

- However, Members are ultimately responsible for ensuring that all approved expenses are incurred in the discharge of their parliamentary functions.
- Members' expenditures are subject to the Members By-law and the Members' Allowances and Services Manual. The Members' Expenditures Report presents expenditures by budget and expense category (eight main categories). Some categories (i.e. Travel, Printing and Offices) are subdivided to provide further information.
- The House Administration produces and publishes over 4,000 reports annually since three reports are produced every quarter for each Member: the *Members' Expenditures Report*, the *Detailed Travel Points Report* and the *Detailed Hospitality Expenditures Report*.

Facts about the Board of Internal Economy

- The Board of Internal Economy is the governing body of the House of Commons.
- It is created by the *Parliament of Canada Act* and has equal representation from the governing party and the officially recognized parties (i.e. those holding at least 12 seats in the House), in addition to the Speaker of the House.
- It is chaired by the Speaker of the House.
- The Board is responsible for establishing by-laws, policies and guidelines relating to expenditures and resources provided to Members in order to carry out their parliamentary functions. This authority is given to the Board by the *Parliament of Canada Act*.
- The Board is committed to public disclosure and posts the minutes of its meetings, along with other key documents, on <u>parl.gc.ca</u>.
