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I. Introduction

Purpose of the Privacy Act

The *Privacy Act* (Revised Statutes of Canada, Chapter A-1, 1985) was proclaimed on July 1, 1983.

The purpose of this Act is to extend the present laws of Canada that protect the privacy of individuals with respect to personal information about themselves held by a government institution and to provide to the individuals a right of access to this information.

Under Section 72 (1) of the *Privacy Act*, the head of every government institution is required to prepare an annual report to Parliament on the administration of the respective Acts within the institution during each fiscal year.

In accordance with Treasury Board, this report highlights changes and new developments and excludes repetition of information previously reported.

FPCC's Mandate

The Farm Products Council of Canada (FPCC), was established in 1972 under the *Farm Products Agencies Act* (the Act) as a unique public interest oversight body which reports to Parliament through the Minister of Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada (The Minister).

The FPCC; headed by a Chairperson (Deputy Head) appointed by the Governor-in Council, is composed of up to seven Members of which at least half must be primary producers at the time of their appointment.

The Act provides for the creation of National Marketing Agencies and Promotion Research Agencies. There are currently four Marketing Agencies: Canadian Hatching Egg Producers, Chicken Farmers of Canada, Egg Farmers of Canada and Turkey Farmers of Canada. There is also one Promotion Research Agency, Canada Beef. The FPCC supervises and works with these agencies to ensure that the supply management system for poultry and eggs and promotion research activities for beef cattle work in the balanced interest of all stakeholders, from producers to consumers, and can evolve to respond to current and future challenges.

The FPCC also provides advice and recommendations to the Minister, collaborates with provincial supervisory boards and actively works with the Department and Agriculture and Agri-Food Portfolio Organizations.

Tabling

The annual reports are tabled in Parliament in accordance with section 72 of the Privacy Act.

II. FPCC Structure

Administration and Functional Information

The Chief Financial Officer has delegated authority to oversee the administration of the *Privacy Act* within Farm Products Council of Canada and to ensure compliance with the legislation. FPCC has currently one ATIP Coordinator within, however relies on Agriculture & Agri-Food Canada whom acts as a service provider to the organization.

III. Delegation of Authority

Privacy Act Designation Order

Section 73 of the Privacy Act provides for the Minister, as head of Agriculture & Agri-Food Canada, to delegate the powers, duties and functions designated by the acts.
