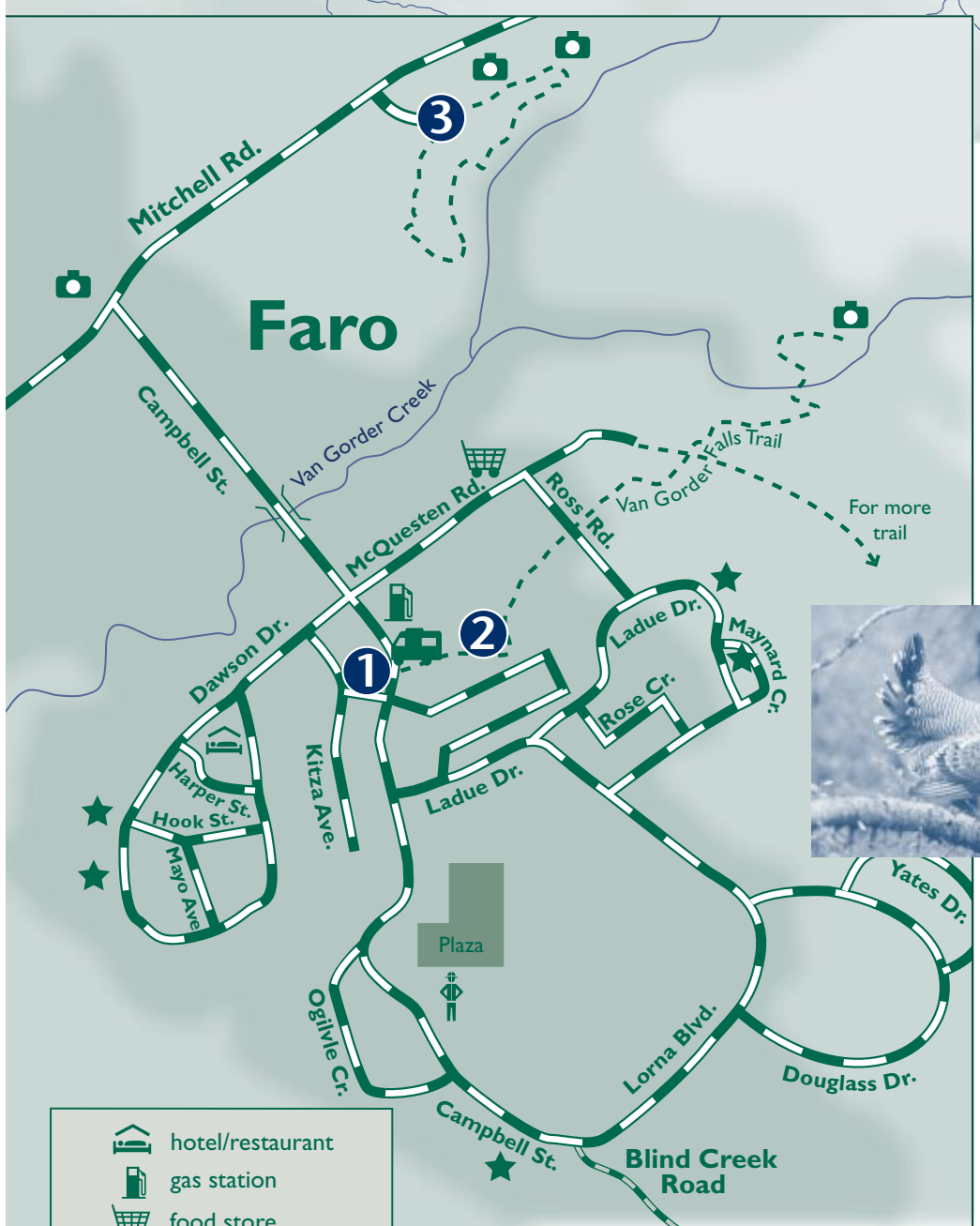

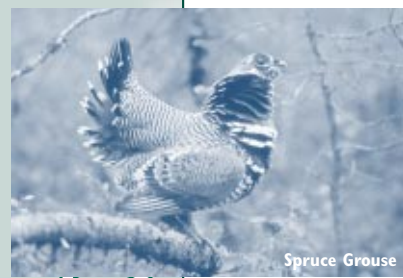

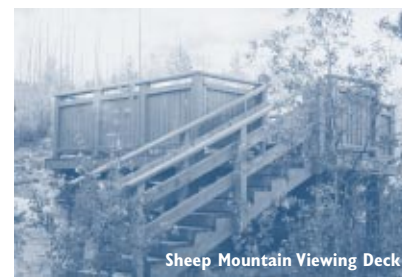
Other places to visit and experience nature:

Several local lakes are good for fishing. Short dirt roads lead to **Eleanor Lake** and **Black Powder Lake**. Eleanor Lake is rumoured to have good northern pike fishing. **Cousins Lake** is easy to portage to from the highway. Canoeing and arctic grayling fishing are highlights.

A short drive down the old mine access road near **Black Powder Lake** provides access to the **Pelly River** upstream of the town. **Dickson Lake** is a long day hike from the Faro mine road. Overnight and day hikes can be planned to **Faro Peak** and **Rose Mountain**, or multi-day trips to **Ross River** or **Dena Cho Trail**. Pickup a *Faro Trails* brochure for details. These roads and trails are not marked, and some are not maintained, but local people may help you find these out of the way places.

Wildlife Viewing Tips

- Bring binoculars and/or a spotting scope for a closer look without disturbing the animals.
- Get to know the species you wish to see. Find out which habitat type it prefers, when it is active and where it is most likely to be found.
- Spend time quietly observing after your arrival. Animals that have hidden from view may reveal themselves after they sense no danger.
- You may find what appears to be an "orphaned" bird or animal. Please leave it behind. The parents are most certainly nearby, waiting for you to move away before coming back to retrieve their offspring.
- Never allow your pet to run at large.
