



FISH (from left, down to right, up)

- · What is the most widely distributed fish in Canada? Northern Pike
- · The other name for this fish is Steelhead. Rainbow Trout
- · This trout is the second largest of its family in North America. Lake Trout
- There was once a bounty on this trout of 2 ½ cents per tail. <u>Dolly Varden</u>
- · It is very difficult to distinguish this fish from its relative, the Dolly Varden. Bull Trout
- · This is the most abundant salmon species in Yukon. Chum Salmon
- · This fish is found through the north and is a highly valued food. Arctic Char
- · This fish' name means 'unknown' in French. Inconnu
- · Also known as 'Kings', these are the largest of the Pacific Salmon. Chinook Salmon
- These tiny fish are awkward swimmers that seem to hop along the bottom. Slimy Sculpin
- · Also known as Lingcod, it is the only freshwater member of the cod family. Burbot
- · This fish has an oversized sail-like dorsal fin. Arctic Grayling
- · The oldest of this fish species in Yukon was 37 years old and weighed only 0.9 kg. Lake Whitefish
- · Sockey salmon spend their lives at sea before returning to rivers to spawn. What is the name of the same fish that never goes to the sea? Kokanee
