


October Business Barometer


During the past three years, did your business purchase from and/or sell to countries outside of Canada? (Goods and/or services) (% response)


If you have traded during the past three years, with which market? (% responses)


If your business has not sold goods and/or services to countries outside of Canada, nor has any plans to do so, what are the main reasons? (% response)

Summary

- ► Strong majority of SMEs support free and fair trade
- ► Many SMEs will benefit from CETA and the TPP
- ► Some, including supply managed producers and small auto-parts manufacturers, may have strong concerns
- ► Ensure that any economic harm to supply managed producers as a result of the trade deal be compensated
- ► Encouraged by dedicated SME chapter but action must follow so that small firms can see and feel the difference on the ground.
