I would like to request to increase training for handling medical equipment. A wheelchair is a person's legs, if it breaks, it is limiting even more that persons mobility and even though the air carrier will pay for the replacement, the time it takes to be replaced causes numerous inconveniences for the family and the disabled person.

It would be useful if there is a row where the seats can recline more than they do know. My son has cerebral palsy and It is hard for him to sit upright; it would be a lot more comfortable for him and for the companion if the seat could recline at 45 degrees.
