D. Intercity Mileage

1. Channel Measurement (See Note)

a) Two Point Channel:

- (1) The mileage charge is based on the rate distance (chargeable mileage) between the service points of the cities in which the stations are located.
- (2) The rate distance is determined as follows:
 - (i) For points not more than 10 miles apart by airline (map) measurement, the rate distance is the airline distance between them.
 - (ii) For points more than 10 miles apart by airline measurement, the rate distance is based on the vertical (V) and horizontal (H) coordinates of the points. Such distance is the square root of one-tenth the sum of the square of the difference between the V coordinates and the square of the difference between the H coordinates, any remaining fraction of mile being carried to the next higher mile.

b) Multi Point Channel:

The rate distance and charge for each of the combinations of pairs of cities (each leg of the circuit) is determined separately (per Item 202.D.1.a above). The total charge is the <u>sum of the charges</u> for the lowest combination of rate distances that connect all service points.

- (a) For service between points in Northwestel's operating area, mileage charges are measured as per items 202.D.1.a and b.
- (b) (1) Subject to (2), for service between Northwestel's operating area and a point in British Columbia not served by Northwestel or in Alberta, mileage charges are measured as per items 202.D.1.a and b.
 - (2) For service between Northwestel's operating area and a point in British Columbia not served by Northwestel, where the circuit is provided jointly with TELUS Communications BC, mileage charges are measured via the gateway at Dawson Creek, British Columbia except for a circuit between Whitehorse, Yukon and Atlin, British Columbia where the mileage will be measured at a point mid-air between White Mountain, Yukon and Atlin, British Columbia.
- (c) For service between Northwestel's operating area in the Yukon or British Columbia and a point in Canada (excluding service to areas described in (a) and (b) above), mileage charges are measured via the gateway at BALTA.

E. Drop-Service Charge

- 1. When telephones or service points in more than two cities are connected by the same channel, a monthly dropservice charge of \$25.60 applies at each city other than the two terminals, regardless of the number of telephones or service points connected in any such city, in addition to all other rates and charges.
- 2. In determining the application of drop-service charges for a multi-point channel that has telephones or service points in Canada and Alaska, the Canadian part of the inter-city channel is considered separately, the border-crossing point is classed as a terminal. When two or more inter-city channels, each extended from a different border-crossing point, are used to connect telephones or service points in Canada to a channel in Alaska, each such Canadian channel is considered separately in the application of drop-service charges.

F. Interruptions

- 1. Rebates for interruptions are computed as detailed below. A rebate may also apply for terminating equipment made inoperable because of an interruption to the circuit.
- 2. For a channel between points in the same city, no rebate is made for an interruption if operation is restored on the day on which the Company learns of it or on the following day. For a later restoral, the Company makes a rebate of the proportionate part of the monthly charge for the total period during which the interruption continues.
- 3. For an inter-city channel, the duration of each interruption is computed from the time at which the Company learns of it. No rebate is made for any interruption of less than 30 minutes. Each interruption of 30 minutes or more is credited in multiples of one-half hour, any remaining fraction of 30 minutes being counted as one-half hour. The total of all such interruptions during the month determines the amount to be credited to the subscriber.

Manned Installation Charge Exemptions

Digital Direct-CommunityTM Satellite Service manned installation charges will be waived for:

- (1) A current Digital Direct-CommunityTM Satellite Service customer who wants to increase the speed of its circuit or the length of its contract or both; and
- (2) A current analogue private line service customer who wants to converts its circuit(s) to Digital Direct-CommunityTM Satellite Service,

provided that:

- (1) the customer's new Digital Direct -CommunityTM Satellite Service contract period is equal to or greater in length than the period outstanding on their existing contract; and
- (2) in the case of a customer upgrading the speed of an existing Digital Direct-CommunityTM Satellite Service, the rate for the new circuit will depend on the customer's new contract period.

There are no exemptions for unmanned installation.

11. Compatible Services

Digital Network Access will be provided as per Tariff CRTC 3003, Item 1111.

In order to connect the customer's premises to Digital Direct-CommunityTM Satellite Service central offices, the service may be used in conjunction with Digital Private Line Services – Digital Network Access as per tariff CRTC 3003, Item 1111, at the rates, terms and conditions set out in that item.
