





HOW THE PROGRAM WORKS

The Mentoring Partnership is a collaboration of service delivery and employer partners, and operates as a program of the Toronto Region Immigrant Employment Council (TRIEC).

EMPLOYER PARTNERS THE MENTORING DELIVERY PARTNERS

Employer Partners

promote the mentoring opportunity internally to staff and encourage suitable, qualified staff to become mentors.

The Mentoring Partnership

manages the program and supports the efforts of community and employer partners to develop effective mentoring relationships.

Service Delivery Partners

deliver the program by matching mentors with skilled immigrants and coaching mentors and mentees throughout the relationship.

Mentees are job-ready immigrant professionals who need help getting their foot in the door.

WHO CAN BE A MENTOR?

Mentors must have worked in their field for at least three years and have a combination of industry knowledge and business experience. They should have active networks and recent experience in their occupational field.

Mentors support mentees in:

- developing their professional networks and job-search strategies
- understanding the Canadian context of their profession and workplace culture
- sharing information on their industry and occupation

The Mentor Commitment:

Mentors commit to a total of 24 hours over four months. Meetings can be in person, online, over the phone and include referral meetings.

WHO CAN BE A MENTEE?

Mentees must:

- have lived in Canada for less than three years OR have lived in Canada more than three years but have recently re-engaged with your profession through an academic training or bridging program
- be assessed to have the English skills required to perform effectively in the workplace
- have at least three years of international work experience in your area of expertise before coming to Canada
- have achieved at least a bachelor's degree or equivalent post-secondary education - from outside of Canada
- be eligible to work in Canada
- be actively seeking work in your field
- have limited or no Canadian work experience in your field
- be currently unemployed or underemployed, i.e. not working, not working full-time or not working in your field of expertise or at your level of experience

All potential mentees must meet with a mentoring coach at one of our service delivery partners to check their eligibility and be assessed for the program.
