



Faculty Positions in Brain Imaging McGill University



The Montreal Consortium for Brain Imaging Research (MCBIR) at McGill University is conducting an international recruiting effort. MCBIR is a multi-institutional initiative which expands the McConnell Brain Imaging Centre (BIC) at the Montreal Neurological Institute (MNI) and is part of one of the largest most diverse neuroscience communities in North America. The recruitment of new faculty members for MCBIR is a partnership between the MNI, the Douglas Hospital and the Lady Davis Institute. The MNI is a broad-based research institute with 45 independent labs, 150+ graduate students and 50+ postdocs. The Douglas Hospital Research Centre is one of the largest psychiatric research institutes in Canada and the Lady Davis Institute is a major international center for research in aging, dementia, cancer and AIDS. All are integrated with referral hospitals.

MCBIR has received a \$28M government grant for an addition to the BIC that will house state-of-the-art scanners for human MRI, fMRI, PET and MEG as well as animal PET and MRI; extensive computer resources; and new laboratories.

We seek applications for tenure track faculty positions at all levels for research in neuroscience and imaging technology. We offer highly attractive salary and start-up packages and an exceedingly high quality of life in Montreal, one of North America's greatest and most lively cities.

Applicants should have an MD, a PhD or the equivalent and at least three years of postdoctoral research training. Clinician scientists with combined degrees are encouraged to apply.
