Major weekend work blitzes on the Jacques Cartier Bridge in May 2020

Longueuil, Friday, May 8, 2020 – The Jacques Cartier and Champlain Bridges Incorporated (JCCBI) wishes to advise users that major levelling and paving work will be done on the Jacques Cartier Bridge during weekend work blitzes in May. Thus, two major blitzes have been scheduled for the weekends of May 22 to 25 and May 29 to June 1, 2020. Only one lane per direction will be open to traffic during these blitzes, which will run from 8:00 p.m. on Friday to 12:00 p.m. on Monday. The sector should be avoided.

Note that the sidewalk will remain closed during this period and that the multipurpose path will be kept open during work.

This work is being closely coordinated with our mobility partners and is part of the major repairs being done to extend the service life of the Jacques Cartier Bridge.

Closures are required during the work to ensure user and worker safety. JCCBI recommends that users plan their travel. Note that this work could be postponed due to unsuitable weather conditions.
