Decision:

The Chief Safety Officer authorizes the Applicant, the owner of the MODU Henry Goodrich, to accept the level of passive fire protection in the accommodations in accordance with DNVGL-OS-D301 Fire Protection and the IMO Modu Code, in lieu of the passive fire protection requirements for accommodations specified in the Petroleum Installation Regulations, as long as all equipment outlined in the Application is functioning and the additional measures as outlined in the Application are adhered to. This is also subject to the following conditions:

- The amount of flammables and combustibles that are stored in the sack and chemical storage, laundry room, warehouse areas, rubber goods storage and dry stores is reduced to as low as reasonably practicable.
- If the Port Forward Thruster Room or Port/Forward SCR Room are used for other purposes than outlined in the application then a revision to this approval is to be submitted.
